CHILDREN'S SERVICES

An update on Children's Services during April including activities and staffing updates.





During April in Children's Services, we delivered the Easter Holiday Programme. We had 57 individual young people attending over the course of two weeks. We had a variety of sessions running within PAS and outwith PAS. This included a themed 'Under The Sea' sensory session, a visit to The Workshop for clay modelling, swimming at Perth Leisure Pool and some outdoor fun at Active Kids Adventure Park! We also had two day trips to Stirling Castle and Camperdown Wildlife Centre.

After Easter, the team have been busy planning, tidying and cleaning for the Term 2 programme that begins w/c 22nd April. We currently have 108 individuals signed up for Perth and Outreach programmes. We will be delivering 13 groups a week in Perth and going out to all 4 Outreach areas - Crieff, Kinross, Blairgowrie and Pitlochry on a fortnightly basis.


We have 4 volunteers helping us out in Term 2 - Daniel, Barbara, Julius and Ricki. We will also be welcoming a new Autism Practitioner to the team called Sophie!





TRANSITIONS SERVICES

An update on Transitions Services during April including activities and staffing updates.



In April, we delivered our Easter Holiday programme where we ran two successful Holiday Hangout sessions and a trip to the 'Calamity Jane' production with the tickets being donated from the Perthshire Amateur Operatic Society. We rounded off the week with a trip to the National Museum of Scotland in Edinburgh, taking in the sights and building the young people's independent travel skills by taking the public bus.

We are also piloting our first 'drop-in' sessions, focused on study sessions for registered young people who are currently on study leave and looking for a change in scenery, facilitated by the Transitions Engage staff. Our pilot Duke of Edinburgh, Bronze group will be recommencing this week on the lead up to our expedition in June.


We have met with our 2024-25 Youth Voice Panel to establish goals for this year thinking about awareness and networking with other c youth services. We also have two young people involved in the new Perth and Kinross Youth Forum.

Hannah has joined the Transitions Service and will be working between Employability and Engage. Nathan has also recently joined the Transitions Service to work with the Engage Team.



FAMILY AND EDUCATION SERVICES

An update on Family and Education Services during April.



In FES services in April 2024 we have:

Worked with 26 families for 1:1 work, closed 2 cases and 13 cases on the waiting list with the longest wait being 5 months. We have had some good feedback from parents including a parent who said, "I feel more supported after the FES input and feel more able to manage."

We delivered training to the whole staff team at Kinross Primary School on the in-service day on 15th April which went really well. Donna is now trained in delivering the Incredible years Training for autism and will be co-delivering this parent training with the Parent and Family Learning Team from August 2024. More information to follow!

We have moved our FES application onto Microsoft forms and registration booking is now being done by Jennifer.


We have said goodbye to 2 staff this month - Alison and Alice will be greatly missed. Recruitment for these posts will go out in May.





ENTERPRISE AND EMPLOYABILITY SERVICES

An update on Enterprise and Employability during April.



Work experiences have been being completed including a day out at The Crannog Centre with a group from The Community School of Auchterarder. We also supported a group from Bertha Park High School to attend SSE which included travelling by public transport to attend work experience sessions. This was very successful and hopefully the start of a new working partnership with SSE.

Funding news – successful in receiving funding from both PKC Challenge Fund and the AVIVA Foundation. This means we are now recruiting for a new full time Employability Coordinator.

Our first Create:DIVERSITY project for 2024 kicked off at the end of March. This is a shorter 'taster' project until June. Our focus is to create some gift ideas that might appeal to dads, grandads and any other significant role models for Fathers Day (16th June). These will go on sale in Reception next month so watch this space!

Club:DIVERSITY returns on Saturday 27th April, 1-4pm, after a little spring break for the school Easter holidays and will run fortnightly.
